

Sixth Form Music Scholarship - September 2026 Examination dates: Tuesday 4 November or Thursday 6 November 2025

Closing Date for applications: 19 September 2025

The Scholarship audition will generally take place in conjunction with the sixth form entrance examinations on either Tuesday 4 November or Thursday 6 November 2025. It may be taken at a later date by arrangement but the School cannot guarantee that a place will be available for September, if this is after the academic entrance examinations.

The audition

Candidates should prepare the following:

- two contrasting pieces on their principal instrument
- one piece on another instrument (if offered see below)

Additionally, candidates will be given:

- a sight reading test on their principal instrument
- aural tests
- an opportunity to talk about their musical interests and experience

General points

- For the 16+ music scholarship it would be normally expected that a candidate would demonstrate ability on their principal instrument at approximately Grade 8 standard, though it is not mandatory for candidates to have passed this examination.
- We are looking for musical potential and commitment and candidates are advised to perform
 music that they are comfortable with more credit is given for an outstanding performance of a
 piece of reasonable difficulty than for a mediocre performance of a very difficult piece.
- Candidates who play one instrument only are encouraged to apply.
- We place considerable emphasis on singing in the department but it is very rare for a scholarship to be awarded to a candidate who only offers voice.
- An accompanist will be available for the scholarships though candidates are very welcome to bring their own pianist if they prefer.
- Before submitting their application candidates are encouraged to meet the Director of Music for an informal pre-audition. This is an ideal opportunity to talk about aspects of music at Rugby School and for the candidates to meet some of the music staff who will be involved in the scholarship audition.

• All awards are conditional upon the academic entrance requirements of Rugby being met.

Awards may be reviewed from time to time and are conditional upon satisfactory progress and attitude being maintained.

Award and Augmentation

If a scholarship is awarded, fees may be augmented by means-tested bursary support up to 100% of the boarding or day fees for UK residents.

Bursary applications are made via an online system, please complete the <u>Bursary Application Form</u> to register your interest. You will then be sent an email containing a link to create an account and begin a Bursary application. In order for your bursary application to be considered, your child must be registered with the School and the Registration Fee (if applicable) paid in full. Applications submitted after the closing date may not be assessed until after the result of a scholarship application is known.
